Following the distribution of questionnaires last week, a number of residents have queried the figures in the covering letter which quote the total incidents dealt with each year by the Constables.

To assist those filling in the questionnaire, the information below may provide a better explanation of the nature of the incidents and give more insight into the work covered by the Constable. The information is collated from the annual report presented to Michaelmas Chief Pleas each year by the outgoing Constable.

At present there is no set formula for classification so each Constable may interpret incidents differently but the figures do give more detailed information on which to base your answers.

Although only one copy was distributed to each household, further copies are available from the Gallery Stores for individuals or from the Committee Office for businesses.

It should be noted that there is currently no consistency in the recording of incidents, each Constable making their own judgement as to the category selected; there will inevitably be some overlap but this analysis gives better insight to the trends shown by the overall number of incidents.
